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2021 Back to Learning Campaign



Scope: Provinces with high numbers of refugee populations (national scope)

Timeframe: August – December 2021

Key Objectives (covering both refugee and host population):

- Disseminate key messages:
 - Importance of learning everywhere
 - Safe return to school for the new academic year (COVID-19 safety and hygiene practices)
 - Promote social cohesion in schools and communities
- Overcome enrolment/registration barriers (problem log)
- Advocating with relevant stakeholders on challenges hampering school enrollment and attendance
- Evidence generation on school enrollment with emphasis on the impact of COVID-19 (parents survey)

2021 BTLCampaign – Data Collection and Guiding Tools



Info Pack:

- Prepared to guide organizations to conduct BTL activities.
- Contains general advocacy and key massages, school registration process, available education opportunities and incentives, suggested activities, information about data collection tools and FAQs.
- Available in English, Turkish and Arabic

Problem Log:

- An online tool that enables members to report any challenges families and/or children face during the school registration
- Reporting organizations to follow up

Parents Survey:

- This survey aims to:
 - Identify the patterns of challenges faced during registration to schools,
 - Capture the reasons for dropping out or being out of school,
 - o Capture the trends in access to EBA.
- Available in English, Turkish and Arabic
- The survey can be completed independently by families.

FINDINGS OF THE PARENTS SURVEY

Parents Survey Overview



- From the begining of August 2021, Education Working Group initiated Back to Learning activities for 2021-2022 school year.
- Data for the exercise has been collected through a survey responded by the parents.
- The main objectives of the data collection were
 - -identify the enrollment status of the children,
 - -capture the reasons for **being out of school**,
 - -identify the main challeges faced during registration
- -capture the **effect of Covid-19 pandemic** for access and learning of the child.

- For the first time this year, the data collection tool was accesible for both the member organizations to use during interview with their beneficiaries, and also for the beneficiaries to fill the survey through KoBo link autonomously.
- This presentation presents the findings for the 2021 BTL data collection exercise.
- Data collection process has been held between August and October 2021.






Geographical Breakdown of children identified










Comparison of the 2021 Sample with the Previous Years





Reasons for being OOS 2021




Not being able to cover school expenses Child is working Disability of child Overage for the registered class Faced peer bullying from other students, so dropped out Lack of Turkish language understanding Supporting household chores (Including taking care of elderly/siblings) Problems faced during registration Distance to school/transportation problems Social/cultural reasons (gender-mixed classrooms, etc.) Concerns about their health and safety during the Covid-19 pandemic Family has no interest of education at all Attended before but dropped out due to academic failure Frequent change of residence / willing to move in near future Lack of information about relevant education opportunities/pathways Child is engaged / married Concerns regarding sending to TPSs including losing native language The closest/previous TEC is closed this year Faced exclusion from teachers, managers, so dropped out Just moved from the camps to urban area and not settled yet






Reasons for being OOS compared with 2018, 2019, and 2020



Reasons for being OOS by Gender






Reasons for being OOS by Age Group









Sanliurfa

50% of the parents living in Sanliurfa responded that their children **never** or **rarely** accessed EBA in 2020-2021 Cohort.

İzmir


Highest rate among all, **52%** of the parents living in İzmir responded that their children **never** accessed EBA or don't even have information about EBA in 2020-2021 Cohort.

Istanbul

The most positive rate among all, 27% of the parents living in Istanbul responded that their children most of the times, and always accessed to EBA in 2020-2021 Cohort.

Access to EBA/Challenges






No device (58%)

was the most mentioned challenge in access to EBA. The unavailability of internet connection (37%), was the second. Third challenge was, not enough devices (32%). Last year the challenges were in the same order with close percentages.

No device

was also the most mentioned challenge in provinces as well. **Unavailability of the internet connection** is highlighted in Sanliurfa and Adana.


Not enough devices remain as a problem for all provinces, but **Gaziantep** has the highest rate while **Istanbul** is the **lowest**.











Did your child ever go to the EBA Support Centers?





Challenges faced in accessing EBA Support Centers









Awareness of the COVID-19 measures in schools and classrooms

By Province




Gaziantep
